- ☠ Host/co-host towns subsidize attendance of their own residents. *Proof of residency is required at event.*
- ☠ Visitors from towns listed at right may attend other events at their town's expense **WITH A VISITOR AUTHORIZATION FORM** from their town's Hazardous Waste coordinator. Subsidized quantities may be limited by town. *Proof of residency is required at event.*
- ☠ Visitors **without an authorization form** may pay by check: \$24 per 10 gallons (liquid container size) or 20 lbs. (solid material), or \$45 per 25 gal liquid, 50 lbs. solid.
- ☠ Commercial generators contact Amanda at Stericycle, **617.852.3086** to prearrange collection and payment.

We're too BAD for the Trash

Accepted at some events:

- motor oil*
- fluorescent tubes*
- compact fluorescents *
- rechargeable and button batteries *

Accepted at all events:

From the workbench:

- oil based paint and stains *
- hobby/artist supplies
- photography chemicals
- fiberglass resins
- adhesives

From the garage:

- flammable liquids and aerosols
- gasoline
- motor oil mixtures
- automotive fluids
- tire and carburetor cleaners, degreasers
- marine and auto paints

From the shed:

- pesticides, herbicides, fungicides
- fertilizers containing pesticides
- pool chemicals
- cesspool cleaners
- wood preservatives

From the house:

- mercury, including thermometers and thermostats *
- drain cleaners
- moth balls and crystals
- hazardous cleaners and polishes
- poisons
- acids and bases

Asbestos (friable): **CALL AHEAD 781.329.8318**

Materials not accepted include:

- industrial waste
- radioactive materials (*smoke detectors may be disposed in trash*)
- pathological and medical waste
- pressurized gas cylinders *
- lead acid (automotive) batteries *
- explosives (*contact your fire department*)

*** These materials are collected regularly by many retailers and/or towns**



**Latex paint is messy,
*but not hazardous***

If your paint is still usable (smooth and not smelly), it MAY be accepted. You may also bring it to The Paint Exchange in Rockland to be recycled into new paint. A \$2 processing fee may apply.

If your paint's not that great: remove lid. Air dry or absorb with cat litter or paint hardener, and dispose with trash.

Bring chemicals in labeled, covered containers
